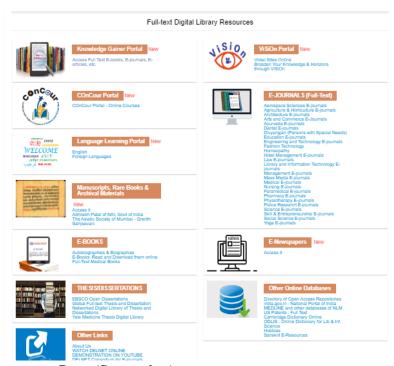

Then it was supported by the National Informatics Centre, Dept. of Information Technology, Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, Govt. of India, and the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India. DELNET is awarded with Prestigious IIPA award for excellence in public service on October 2020.

• Aims and Objectives of the DELNET:

DELNET aims to collect, store, and disseminate information besides offering networked library services to users. DELNET started compiling various Union Catalogues of the resources available in member libraries.
