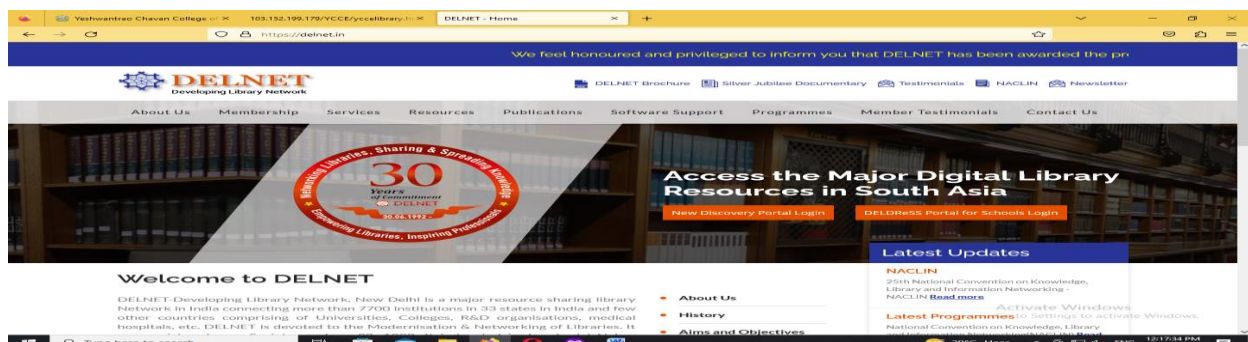
Introduction :

DELNET- (Developing Library Network, India) :



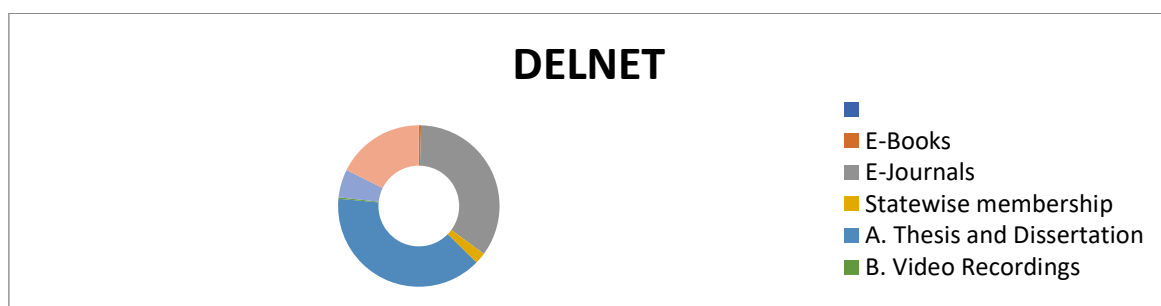

Objectives of the DELNET:

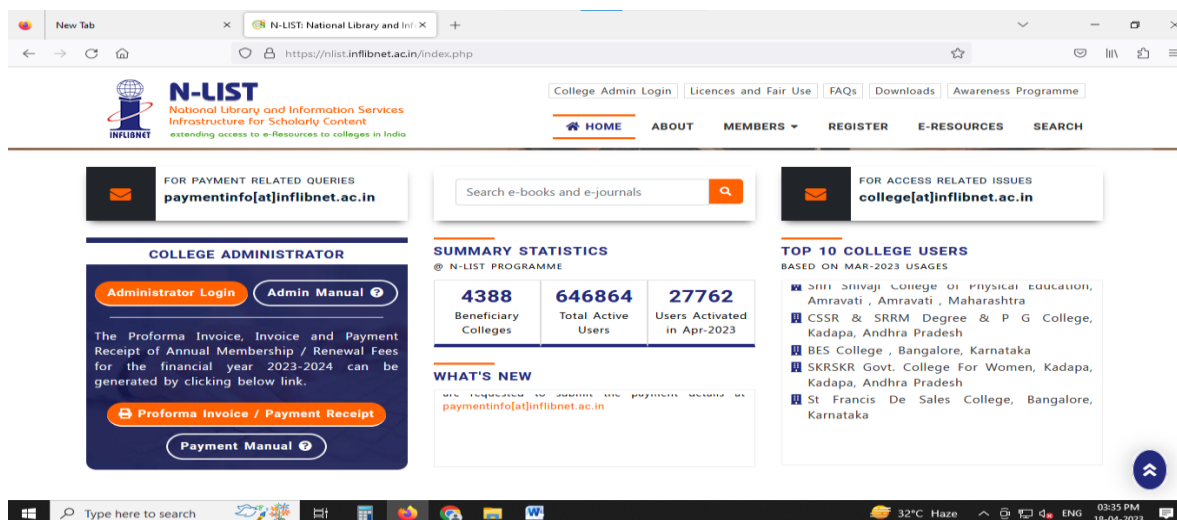
1. Foster resource sharing among member libraries.

Four distinct components are present in the N-LIST

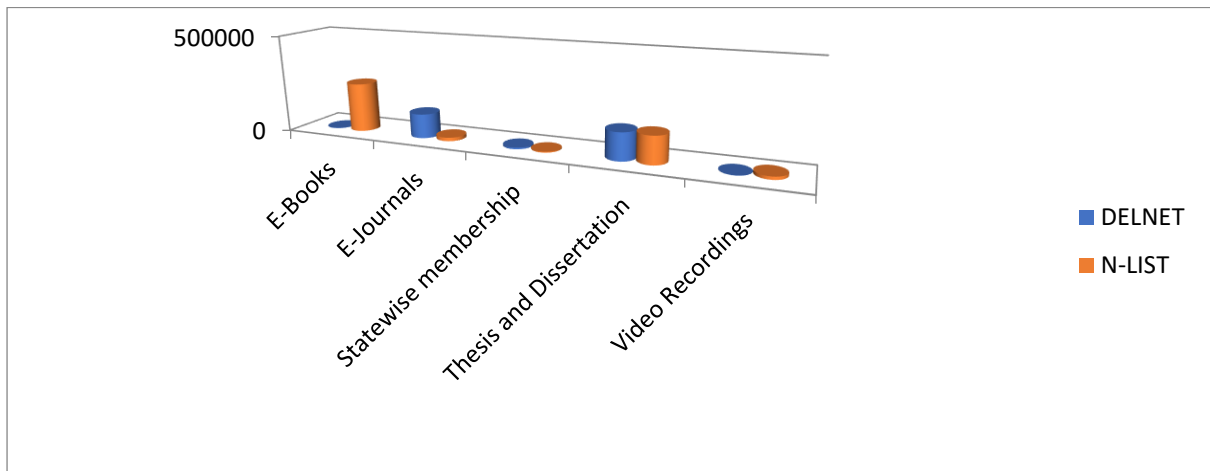
- i) To offers a subscription service that provides technical institutions with a range of electronic resources for their use.
- ii) To subscribe a selected INDEST electronic resources to the universities.
- iii) Subscription of selected e-resources to the colleges.
- iv) Provide an imparting training and to ensure an efficient provision of e-resources to institution by monitoring all activities involved. N-LIST becomes a major hub in India particularly for conventional colleges. Most of the subjects are covered by it. It also good cover for learning and research events.

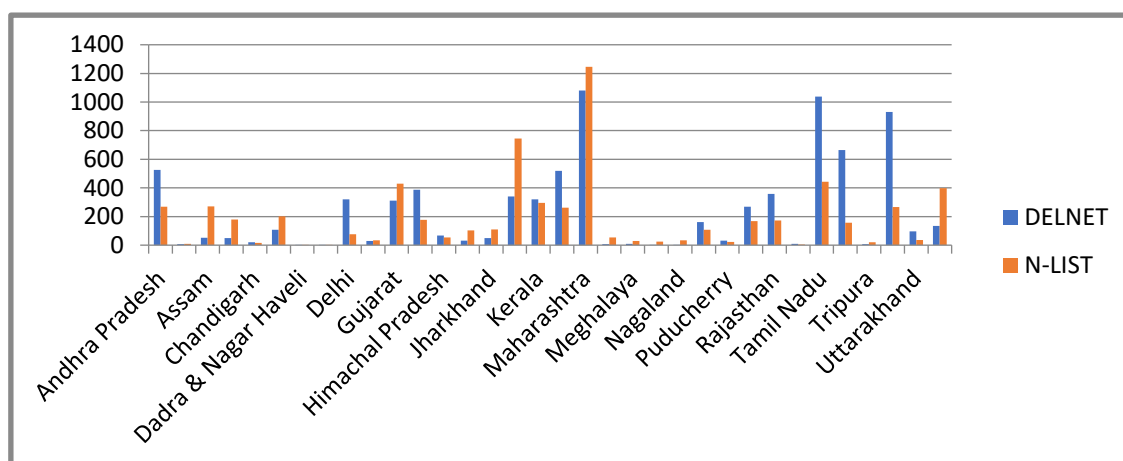
