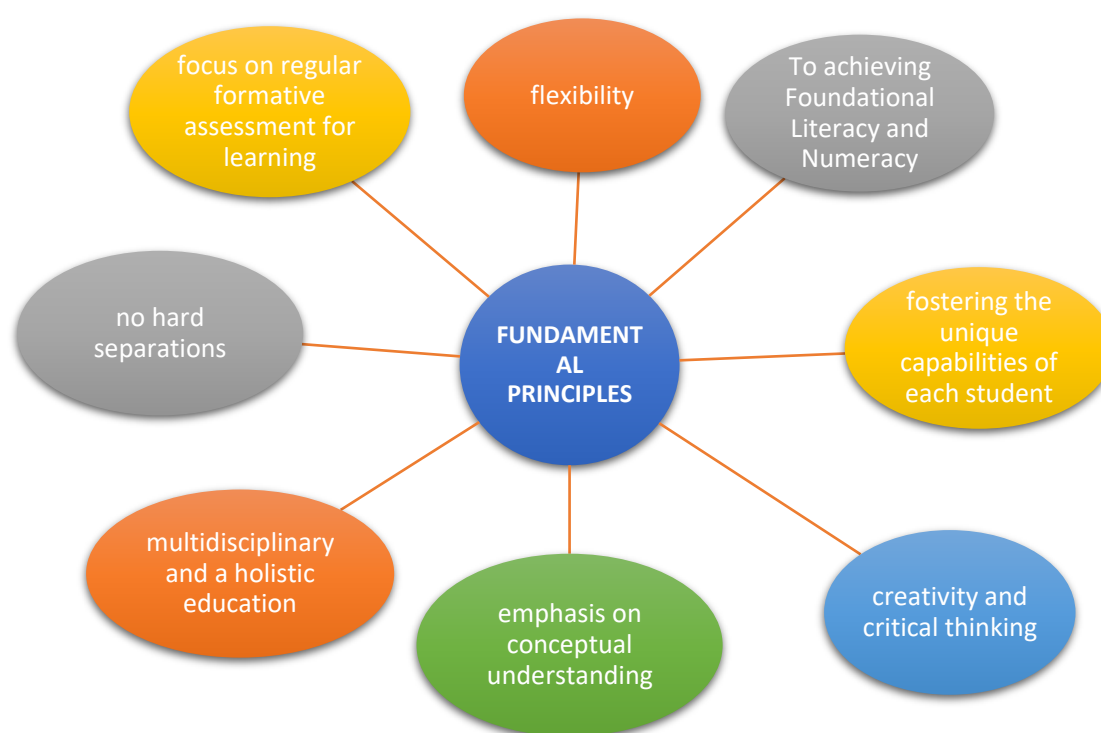
National Education Policy – 2020 :
